Situated just 6 kilometers southeast of the vibrant town of Westport, Aughagower (from the Irish Achadh Ghobhair, meaning 'field of the spring') is a picturesque heritage village steeped in over 1,500 years of history. Historically a significant medieval monastery, it lies at the strategic midpoint of the Tóchar Phádraig, the ancient pilgrimage route that leads from Ballintubber Abbey to the holy mountain of Croagh Patrick. Today, it offers a tranquil escape that perfectly balances rural Irish charm with profound archaeological importance.

The heart of the village is dominated by its remarkable 10th-century Round Tower, which stands as a testament to Aughagower's past as a powerful religious center. Though it lost its capstone to a lightning strike in the 19th century, the tower remains a striking landmark, characterized by a slight, curious lean. Adjacent to the tower lie the ruins of a 15th-century church and a well-preserved graveyard, alongside unique ritual sites such as Leaba Phádraig (St. Patrick's Bed) and Dabhach Phádraig, a circular bath where pilgrims traditionally washed their feet before continuing their spiritual journey.
