Alternatively, Shannon Airport (SNN), located approximately 190 kilometres (also around a 2.5-hour drive) to the north, offers

numerous transatlantic flights to the USA, in addition to European routes. About the Area

Coramore, nestled on the enchanting Valentia Island off the coast of County Kerry, Ireland, is a place where the wild beauty of the Atlantic meets a rich tapestry of history and unique natural phenomena. Valentia Island itself is one of Ireland's most westerly points, a rugged yet serene outpost that forms part of the world-renowned Wild Atlantic Way. Coramore, like much of the island, offers breathtaking vistas of the ocean, the dramatic Kerry coastline, and the stunning Skellig Islands in the distance. The Telegraph Field on the island stands as a testament to this incredible achievement. Even more ancient are the fossilised tetrapod trackways found on the island's north coast at Dohilla, dating back some 385 million years. These footprints represent some of the oldest signs of vertebrate life on land, offering a unique glimpse into Earth's primordial past. The island's rich heritage is further explored at the Valentia Island Heritage Centre, which details its geology, human history, and industrial significance, including its famous slate quarry that supplied material for the Palace of Westminster.

Getting to Coramore on Valentia Island involves a journey into the heart of County Kerry, a region celebrated for its dramatic landscapes. Valentia Island is accessible from the mainland by two primary routes. The most common is via the Maurice O'Neill Memorial Bridge from the charming village of Portmagee, which is on the Iveragh Peninsula. This road bridge offers continuous access to the island. Alternatively, during the warmer months (typically April to October), a car ferry operates from Renard Point, near Cahersiveen, crossing to Knightstown, the island's main settlement. Both Cork and Shannon provide a wider array of international flights. For those arriving

from further afield, Dublin Airport (DUB) is Ireland's primary international hub, from which connections can be made to Kerry Airport, or a longer bus/train/car journey can be undertaken to Valentia Island.
