Brixen (Italian: Bressanone) is one of the oldest towns in South Tyrol and is picturesquely situated in the Eisack Valley, nestled between vineyards, orchards and the imposing Dolomites. With around 22,000 inhabitants, it is a charming blend of history, culture and modern quality of life.

History and culture

The origins of Brixen date back to Roman times, but the city gained its importance primarily in the Middle Ages. Brixen was first mentioned in a document in 901, when it was elevated to the status of a bishop's see. For centuries, the city was an important religious and political center, which is reflected in its magnificent buildings.

Bressanone Cathedral, with its baroque façade and impressive ceiling frescoes, is a landmark of the city. Adjacent to it is the cloister with its Gothic frescoes, which are among the most important works of art in Tyrol. Another highlight is the Hofburg, the former residence of the prince-bishops, which now houses a museum.

Nature and activities

Brixen lies at the foot of the Plose, a popular mountain for hikers, mountain bikers and skiers. In summer, well-marked hiking trails offer spectacular views of the Dolomites, while in winter the Plose boasts perfectly groomed slopes and one of the longest toboggan runs in South Tyrol.

The area around Bressanone/Brixen also invites you to explore. The path through the "Natz-Schabs" nature reserve leads through apple orchards and to traditional Alpine huts, where regional delicacies such as speck, dumplings and cheese are served.

Cuisine and events

South Tyrolean cuisine reflects the mixture of Alpine and Mediterranean culture, and Bressanone is a paradise for gourmets. Restaurants and inns serve traditional dishes such as Schlutzkrapfen, but also modern creations with ingredients from the region.

Special events such as the Brixen "Water Light Festival" or the atmospheric Christmas market attract visitors from near and far. The traditional Törggelen in autumn, where new wine and local specialties are enjoyed, also has a long tradition in Brixen.
