ABOUT THE AREA

Paris? This is a world! Each of its neighborhoods is explored as a country, from Montmartre the villager to the Latin Quarter and the cradle of the Ile de la Cite. And every stone tells us about art, from the centuries-old Louvre Museum to the futuristic Louis Vuitton Foundation. Because Paris is a permanent holiday for culture, including gastronomy. Coming to Paris is a taste of the Parisian way of life. You can start your breakfast with a delicious hot baguette and butter croissants, before wearing Repetto ballerinas for a round of haute couture shopping on Avenue Montaigne, or Saint-Ouen flea dealers. In the afternoon, an obligatory break at the Cafe de Flore, the capital of all literary Paris. In the evening, we take out our Louboutin pumps to listen to an opera in the modern setting of the Bastille Opera or under the eaves of the Opera Garnier. You can also go to the Moulin Rouge or the Lido to applaud the dancers of the new French Cancan. Then all that remains is to return to one of these furiously Parisian hotels, like the Paxton.

Not many cities can rival Paris in the culture stakes. Its hundreds upon hundreds of museums, monuments, and gardens mean no two trips here are the same. Come face-to-face with that iconic Mona Lisa smile at the Louvre. Kick back in the Champ de Mars park after dark to watch the Eiffel Tower sparkle. Or, dip into bohemian Montmartre to shop for art, sip coffee at an outdoor cafe, and catch a cabaret show at the Moulin Rouge.

Getting around town

For a city so big on sights, Paris is surprisingly compact. You can actually walk from the western outskirts to the east in just a couple of hours on a Paris city break. A good starting point for a - slightly shorter - stroll is the Arc de Triomphe. From here, you can wander all the way along the Champs Élysées, past the Tuileries Gardens and the Louvre Museum, all while sticking to the same pedestrianised avenue. Alternatively, hop-on-hop-off boats glide along the Seine. And, Velib' bike stations on every corner make it easy to whizz around on two wheels.

Year-round festivals

All throughout the year, Paris' calendar of events is full to the brim. Bastille Day is the big one. On this date in July, there's a parade along the Champs Élysées and fireworks at the Eiffel Tower, to celebrate France's independence. For the Nuit des Musées, in May, the museums stay open all night and let visitors in for free. Then there's the June Fete de la Musique, when tunes from free, open-air concerts echo through the streets.
